After graduation, I applied for HOPES scholarship. And I would like to thank HOPES programme for giving me this opportunity to complete a master's degree.


I'm supposed to graduate in two years, which means in the beginning of 2019. I always say that I should continue my higher education. I shouldn't stop at the master's degree.
