OBJECTIVE

Strengthen the long-term resilience of targeted subnational authorities and their host/refugee populations in countries affected by the Syrian and Iraqi crises.

- Enhancing subnational authorities' capacities to engage in holistic, areabased planning and consider different scenarios that respond to the needs of host and refugee populations, and internally displaced people (IDPs).
- Increase the responsiveness of service delivery and generate greater social stability outcomes, based on the needs of host and refugee populations, and internally displaced people (IDPs).
- Empowering subnational authorities in facilitating local economic development and have better access to municipal investment that benefits the extension of safe public services and economic opportunities for host and refugee populations, and internally displaced people (IDPs).
