OBJECTIVES

- Empower Syrians living in Turkey, socially and economically, to become an asset to the local economy and contribute to the economic growth of the country;
- Improve the living conditions of Syrians living in Turkey and the population in local communities, and promote social unity amongst them.

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Job creation for Syrians and local communities: Trigger job opportunities and increase the creation of sustainable jobs.
- Municipal service delivery: Construction and rehabilitation of municipal infrastructure, waste management and firefighting services;
- Adult language training: Promote Turkish language skills and knowledge among Syrian men and women.

DETAILED EXPECTED RESULTS

Job creation for Syrians and local communities:

- At least 2 SME Capability Centres and 2 Innovation Centres are made operational;
- At least 2,000 Syrian refugees and local community members gain access to formal job offers;
- At least 1,000 Syrian refugees and local community members gain access to awareness-raising and other types of business development and employment services, including innovation-driven entrepreneurship;
- At least 650 SMEs receive business advisory services in the form of technical assistance and investment/equipment support;
- At least 250 new SMEs focusing on innovation are established by Syrian and/or Syrian-Turkish joint ventures.

Municipal service delivery:

- One Mechanical Biological Treatment facility is constructed;
- One leachate sanitary landfill site is managed and one existing facility is renovated;
- One waste water treatment facility is constructed;

- Three waste transfer stations are constructed;
- The technical capacity of three municipalities to deliver municipal services is increased;
- Access to municipal services is improved for at least 307,000 Syrian people living in Turkey and local community members;
- Firefighting capacities are increased through the provision of equipment and technical support.

Adult language training:

- At least 52,000 Syrians receive Turkish language training (in-classroom and through e-learning portals);
- A learning platform and learning management system are established for Turkish language;
- At least 50 classrooms are refurbished and improved;
- A prefabricated public education centre is constructed:
- Additional training is provided for at least 300 Turkish language trainers;
- Tailor-made educational content is developed, published and distributed.
