Budget Support to the Jordanian Ministry of Education to deal with the Syrian refugee crisis

OBJECTIVES

• Support the Government of Jordan to enhance the capacity of the education system for Syrian refugee children, particularly in camp environments.

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Provide quality education to Syrian pupils.
- Grants for school fees and school books (new and used) for up to 36,000 Syrian refugee children in camps, paid for the school years 2017/18 and 2018/19.
- Contract and pay the salaries of 1,360 teachers and 200 administrators in camps to serve Syrian children, allowing for an overall teacher-pupil ratio of 26:1.
- Provide library, computer and science education services.



HOW DO WE WORK?

The support programme is going to support the Ministry of Education (MoE) of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to cope with the influx of Syrian pupils in the public school system, in line with the Jordan Response Plan (JRP), for the school years 2017/18 and 2018/19.

The main activities to implement the support package are:

- 1. policy dialogue;
- 2. financial transfer;
- 3. performance assessment;
- 4. reporting; and
- 5. capacity development.

Project targets:

Year 1/2017:

At least 1,520 staff in camps, of which at least 1,320 teachers and 200 administrators.

Pupil-Teacher Ratio in all camp schools

(primary and secondary) 26.5:1.

1 package of school books for every pupil, up to 32,000 packages of school books (with 100% new books).

6 camp schools are equipped with functioning libraries, computer labs and science education facilities, equipped with staff and have access to electricity.

Year 2/2018:

At least 1,560 staff in camps, of which at least 1,360 teachers and 200 administrators.

Pupil-Teacher Ratio in all camp schools (primary and secondary) 26:1.

1 package of school books for every pupil, up to 36,000 packages of school books, with -if possible- 10 % reused books in the pilot camp schools.

12 camp schools are equipped with functioning libraries, computer labs and science education facilities, equipped with staff and have access to electricity.
